



North Country Virtual Manga Book Club: Info Sheet

What is it? The North Country Virtual Manga Book Club is a monthly book club, launched in August 2026 and held via Zoom, open to anyone across the North Country of New York. It is a joint project of the Northern NY Manga Interest Group and will be facilitated by library workers from a range of libraries across the region, including the Akwesasne Cultural Center, Canton Free Library, Fulton Public Library, Gouverneur Public Library, Northern New York Library Network, and Plattsburgh Public Library.

What happens at meetings of the NoCo Virtual Manga Book Club? The group picks a genre or theme (e.g., slice of life, shonen, sports, horror, romance, etc.) for each month. Then, participants pick any manga they want to read in that theme, read it before the meeting, and then come nerd out on it with other manga lovers! Each meeting will include some attendant activities and time for sharing recommendations.

When will the book club meet? The book club meets via Zoom on the last Tuesday of each month from 5-6pm.

Who is welcome? Anyone in northern New York is welcome to attend: seasoned manga readers, manga novices, you name it. The book club is for all ages. Participants under 13 years of age must be accompanied by an adult. Parents or caregivers of all participants, no matter their age, are welcome. Intergenerational programs offer special opportunities for lifelong learning and exchange of skills and perspective, and we hope to foster an environment where this is possible. Depending on the quantity of participants, or on the reading interests of the

group, the book club may split into smaller groups to allow for more rich, diverse, or in-depth conversations or reading experiences. Library workers hosting manga clubs that want to connect with others across the region are welcome to bring their groups to this virtual book club.

Why is this book club being started? Manga is one of the fastest-growing readerships in the United States, especially among younger readers. It features wide genre diversity, promotes multimodal learning, supports social emotional learning, allows for deep narrative exploration, and fosters visual literacy. It's also a source of rich storytelling and a whole lot of fun. Many of the group's facilitators came to manga because they saw what an impact it made in terms of teen engagement at their libraries, and many found it purely as readers. To sum it up: reading is awesome, and this is another way to support that.
